ANTIBIOTIC USE AND RESISTANCE

The sixth Australian Report on Antimicrobial Use and Resistance 2025 has just been released. Key findings are:

- Rising resistance to antibiotics – this complicates and limits treatment for infections
- Only 45% of post-surgery antibiotics were deemed appropriate – this can lead to antibiotic resistance
- Vancomycin-resistant Enterococcus faecium (VRE) remains highly prevalent

An accreditation requirement for all Australian hospitals is that antibiotic use is in line with the Therapeutic Guidelines. There is no indication for the use of prophylactic antibiotics in general gastroscopy and colonoscopy procedures. We audit our compliance with this and our results in 2025 were 84.6% overall.
